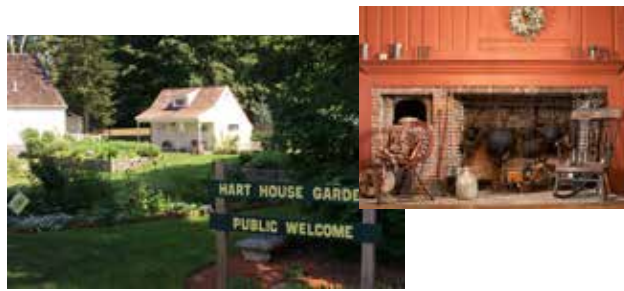


About Us

In 1958 a dedicated group of Old Saybrook citizens formed the Old Saybrook Historical Society, a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving, protecting and promoting the rich history of their town. Today the Society maintains a one acre campus on Main Street. The grounds include the General William Hart House - a 1767 Georgian colonial residence and exhibit gallery, the Frank Stevenson Archives Building and the award-winning public colonial gardens.

The Society fulfills its mission by offering public tours, presenting special exhibits, lectures, programs and events as well as maintaining and displaying its extensive collection of artifacts. Additionally, the Society's archivist, staff and considerable resources of both the Frank Stevenson Archives and the Martha Davis Soper Library are available to anyone tracing a family lineage or researching the history of Old Saybrook.

Engaging the youth of the town is a significant element of the Society's outreach initiatives. In cooperation with public and private schools, the Society provides campus tours to students and support for various projects that relate to the history of Old Saybrook. We offer high school students the opportunity to participate in our Student Volunteer program which furnishes them unique opportunities to develop their leadership skills, interest in local history and commitment to civic involvement.
